Communication No. 1858

ISU Challenger Series in Figure Skating

1. PREAMBLE

As announced in ISU Communication No. 1854 and mindful that the ISU support towards the ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating is restricted to a limited group of organizing ISU Members, to a limited number of Skaters and to a limited number of Officials, the ISU Council agreed to financially support a restricted group of identified ISU Members traditionally staging International Figure Skating Competitions being part of the ISU Event Calendar.

This ISU support has the objective to ensure the proper and consistent organization and conduct of up to eleven (11) International Competitions linked together as a new ISU Series giving adequate opportunities for many Skaters to compete at the international senior level and earn World Standing Points and to increase the opportunity for Officials to officiate at an international level.

The International Competitions (events), which are included into this international Figure Skating ISU Series named “ISU Challenger Series”, must fulfil specific requirements which are summarized in this Communication.

Subject to a sufficient number of organizing ISU Members applying to participate in and able to comply with the requirements for this new ISU Series, it will start with the season 2014/15.

2. MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS FOR APPLICABLE COMPETITIONS

Each International Competition must be of “Senior” category (see ISU General Regulations 2012, Rule 108/1 on page 103) and must include at least 3 disciplines of the Figure Skating Branch (Men, Ladies, Pair Skating, Ice Dance).

The International Competition must be scheduled between August 1 and December 15.

The International Competition must include **entries** from minimum 12 different ISU Members, all disciplines combined.

In addition, the minimum number of **entries** per discipline are as follows:

- Ladies/Men: minimum of 15 entries each, from at least 7 ISU Members;
- Pair Skating: minimum of 8 entries from at least 4 ISU Members;
- Ice Dance: minimum of 10 entries from at least 5 ISU Members.

Entries may be based on invitations extended to selected ISU Members or based open entries available to all ISU Members.

Each competition must strictly comply with the 2014 ISU Constitution, General and Special Regulations and Technical Rules, in particular but not limited to the current Rules in the 2012 Regulations, namely Rules 102, 108, 352 and 353.

Following the principles of Rule 420, paragraph 6. b) of the 2012 Special Regulations Single & Pair Skating/Ice Dance, the members of each individual Technical Panel (Technical Controller and the Technical Specialists) must not be from the same ISU Member. The Technical Panel members must have the qualification of “International”, however one of the three members must have the qualification “ISU”.

The Referee must have at least the qualification “International” and can be of the same ISU Member as one member of the Technical Panel (Technical Controller and Technical Specialists).

The Data Operator and the Replay Operator must have the qualification of at least “International”.

No exception can be granted with respect to the above-mentioned composition of the Technical Panels and the qualification of the Referees and Data & Replay Operators.

The panel of Judges must include at least 7 Judges, all from different ISU Members. Their qualification must be at least “International”.

The Technical Panel members, the Referee and the Data and Replay Operators of International Competitions included in the ISU Challenge Series must be proposed by the respective ISU organizing Member to the ISU Secretariat latest four (4) weeks prior to the first day of the competition. Based on the information received and further to internal ISU consultations, involving possible changes as necessary to comply with the above-mentioned minimum requirements, the ISU Vice President Figure Skating will decide upon the final appointments of the above-mentioned Officials. The respective organizing ISU Member will be informed through the ISU Secretariat and must inform the participating ISU Members accordingly.

Any subsequent changes due to the non-availability of previously appointed Technical Panel members, the Referees and the Data & Replay Operators must be announced by the organizing ISU Member to the ISU Vice President Figure Skating with copy to the ISU Secretariat and the respective ISU Technical Committee Chair(s). If such changes to be approved by the ISU Vice President Figure Skating would not be in line with the above-mentioned minimum requirements, the concerned organizing ISU Members will be notified through the ISU Secretariat for possible adjustments.

If ultimately the organizing Member is unable to apply the necessary adjustments and the final appointments of the above-mentioned Officials would not meet the above-mentioned minimum requirements and have an impact on the status of the concerned International Competition as an event of the ISU Challenger Series and consequently on the World Standing Points and/or the validity of the Minimum Total Technical Scores, then the concerned organizing ISU Member will be informed accordingly through the ISU Secretariat. The organizing ISU Member must inform the participating ISU Members accordingly.

The competition format must include the Short Program and Free Skating in the Single and Pair Skating disciplines and the Short Dance and Free Dance in the Ice Dance discipline.

The competition results must be calculated according to the valid ISU Special Regulations Single & Pair Skating/Ice Dance, currently Rules 352 and 353 of the 2012 Special Regulations Single &/ Pair Skating/Ice Dance.

3. APPLICATION & SELECTION PROCEDURE FOR THE ORGANIZING ISU MEMBERS OF THE EVENTS OF THE ISU CHALLENGER SERIES

ISU Members interested to have an International Competition regularly being organized in their country to become an event of the ISU Challenger Series, must apply to the ISU Secretariat for inclusion into the ISU Challenger Series of their planned International Competition **scheduled between August 1 and December 15** (Application Forms available on the ISU website).

The application must reach the ISU Secretariat (entries@isu.ch) on or before June 1st every season and needs to include:

- Draft of the announcement
- Description of the venue
- Description of the hotel(s)
- Structure of the Organizing Committee
- History/tradition of the International Competition.

After evaluation of the applications received, the ISU Council will decide upon the International Competitions to be included in the ISU Challenger Series giving preference to International Competitions having a certain tradition and continuity. The selected International Competitions (events) included in the ISU Challenger Series will be published through an ISU Communication.

4. PARTICIPATION

Participation is open to all Skaters/Couples of ISU Members, who are eligible for International “Senior” Competitions by age (Rule 108) and by citizenship (109), and entered through the respective ISU Member. There is a limitation for the Skaters/Couples to three (3) participations in the events of the ISU Challenger Series. Participation in any of an ISU Junior Grand Prix event or a (Senior) Grand Prix event does not limit the participation in events of the ISU Challenger Series. However Skaters having participated in the Junior and/or (Senior) ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating during the same season should not have priority to enter events of the Challengers Series.

5. WORLD STANDING POINTS

For the ISU Challenger Series higher World Standing Points than for “regular” International Competitions shall be awarded.

Each competition of the ISU Challenger Series will be awarded with the following scale of points (in brackets for comparison is indicated the number of points for “regular” International Competitions)

As per the valid conditions for the “ISU World Standings Single & Pair Skating/Ice Dance” (ISU Communication 1629 or any update of this Communication) World Standing points are awarded provided that the Draw of the concerned International Competition includes Ladies/Men: minimum 8 Single Skaters from at least 4 ISU Members;

Pair Skating: minimum 5 Pairs from at least 3 ISU Members;
Ice Dance: minimum 6 Ice Dance couples from at least 4 ISU Members.

In addition, each winner of a competition/discipline in an event included in the ISU Challenger Series will be awarded with a position on the alternate list for the ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating of that season, provided the respective timing makes such inclusion still possible. Such Skaters/Couples will be listed in the order of their current World Standing ranking respectively the “Seasons Best Score”.

6. MINIMUM TOTAL TECHNICAL SCORE

Provided that all requirements as per point 2 above are fulfilled, the event of the ISU Challenger Series will count for the required Minimum Total Technical Score to be eligible for participation in ISU Figure Skating Championships (See 2012 Special Regulations Single & Pair Skating/Ice Dance, Rule 378/3).

7. ISU CHALLENGER SERIES RANKING

At the end of the ISU Challenger Series, after the last event of the season has been concluded, the two highest final scores in the up to three different ISU Challenger Series events of each competitor/couple will be added and taken into consideration to form an ISU Challenger Series Ranking which will be published on the ISU website.

8. PRIZE MONEY

The top three placed Skaters/Couples of the annual ISU Challenger Series Ranking will receive ISU Prize Money as follows which will be paid to the concerned Skaters by the ISU through their respective ISU Members:

Men and Ladies:

1 st place	CHF 4'000,00
2 nd place	CHF 3'000,00
3 rd place	CHF 2'000,00

Pair Skating and Ice Dance:

1 st place	CHF 5'000,00
2 nd place	CHF 4'000,00
3 rd place	CHF 3'000,00.

9. ANTI-DOPING TESTS

Anti-Doping Tests are not mandatory, but may be performed at the discretion of each local Organizing Committee in line with the ISU Anti-Doping Code and ISU Anti-Doping Procedures (ISU Communications No 1765 and 1800).

10. OFFICIALS REMUNERATION

The Judges, the Referees, the Technical Controllers, the Technical Specialists and the Data & Replay Operators will, at the expense of the organizing ISU Member, receive pocket money of CHF 200.00 or the equivalent in the local currency.

11. ISU CONTRIBUTION/TV RIGHTS

Each ISU Member, organizing an event included in the ISU Challenger Series will receive an ISU contribution of CHF 20'000. This contribution will be paid when the event has been successfully completed in line with the requirements included in this Communication and the ISU Statutes. The contribution must be used to cover the costs of the Technical Panel in each event, and the honorarium of the Officials. Any remaining funds may cover ice costs or other organizational expenses.

As per Rule 100/3.b)/c) and Rule 105/1.a) of the 2012 ISU General Regulations, the domestic TV rights of the respective event of this ISU series remain with the organizing ISU Member while the international TV rights belong to the ISU.

If a TV production will be provided by the organizing Member of an event of the ISU Challenger Series, the ISU, thanks to its world-wide contacts, will endeavor to exploit these international TV/media rights and secure international TV/media exposure and TV/media right revenues. With the purpose to encourage organizing Members being part of the ISU Challenger Series to provide a TV production of international standard for their respective event of this ISU Series, the ISU is available to share the corresponding revenues emanating from the international TV/media rights to be agreed upon with the respective organizing Member on a case by case basis.
