THE AREA – THE CITY

Tallinn is located in the north-eastern part of the Baltic Region, bordering the Baltic Sea and Gulf of Finland, between Latvia and Russia.

With less than half of million citizens, Tallinn is hardly a world metropolis. However: short distances and low traffic are advantages to cherish. Whether you have only few hours or few days, you get to experience a lot. Medieval Tallinn Old Town, one of the best preserved Hanseatic town centre in the world, is just a short walk away from city business centre with its modern buildings and hotels, luxurious restaurants and shopping malls.

The best time to visit Tallinn is between May and September, when there's up to 19 hours of sunlight, so called "White Nights." On the flipside, December to January is dark, wet, and bitterly cold. Tallinn is an attractive travel destination thanks to its rich cultural heritage and medieval old town. The other side of the coin is a modern city with extra ordinary telecom and Internet solutions. Add innumerable diverse cultural events; bargain shopping and a pulsing nightlife and you have a city that is a must to visit when you are in the Baltic Region.

OLD TOWN

One of the greatest pleasures of a visit to Tallinn is wandering through beautiful Old Town and ducking into alleyways, doorways, and medieval courtyards. The Upper Town, sitting on Toompea Hill, the site of the Parliament buildings, boasts great views and is generally quieter than the larger Lower Town, where most businesses and restaurants are located. In the main square, the Town Hall, built between 1371 and 1404, looks heavy and brooding under its upright spire. The Town Council Pharmacy, on the north side of the square, is another ancient Tallinn institution—there has been a pharmacy or apothecary shop here since at least 1422, though the present facade is 17th-century. The Tallinn Old Town (including *Toompea*) became a [UNESCO World Cultural Heritage](#) site in 1997. Tallinn was also the capital of culture for all Europe in 2011. This was one of the biggest cultural event in the history of Estonia.

As of 21 December 2007, Estonia is a part of the Schengen visa area. Nationals of EU and EEA member states are free to enter Estonia.

The required travel document for entry is a national ID card or passport.

Nationals of the following countries do not need visa to enter Estonia, and can stay for up to 90 days in any 6-month period: Andorra, Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Brunei, Canada, Chile, Costa Rica, Croatia, El Salvador, Guatemala, Holy See, Honduras, Hong Kong, Israel, Japan, Macao, Malaysia, Mexico, Monaco, New Zealand, Nicaragua, Panama, Paraguay, San Marino, Singapore, South Korea, USA, Uruguay, Venezuela.

The required travel document for entry is a valid passport.

Citizens of countries NOT mentioned above require a visa to enter Estonia. Visitors arriving in Estonia with visa must have national passports valid at least 3 months after their planned departure from Estonia. TRAVELLING TO TALLINN

AIRPORT

Tallinn Lennart Meri airport (www.tallinn-airport.ee) is located 4 km from the city centre, just a ten-minute bus ride away.

TRAIN STATION

Tallinn train station is app. 2 km from city centre and a 5 minutes walking distance to the official hotel.

PORT

Port of Tallinn is 1,5 km from city centre. There is connection by ships to Helsinki and Stockholm.

THE VENUE

The competition takes place at Tondiraba Ice Hall, which was built in 2014. The Hall has 3 ice rinks. For the ISU Junior Grand Prix the main rink with the size of 30 x 60m and the practices ice rink with the size of 30 x 60m will be in use.

The distance between Official Hotel and Ice rink is approximately 6 km.

Hotel capacities with special rates can only be booked via the Organizing Committee.

The rooms are equipped with TV, bath/shower, toilet, mini-bar, WIFI, etc
The hotel facilities include Sauna, Beauty Centre, meeting-rooms, bar, etc
Hotel is located near old town and is about 5 walking minutes to Old Town square.
The hotel accepts all kinds of credit cards.

Payment at the Hotels/Extras

The Organizing Committee will cover board and lodging for Event Officials, Judges and Competitors from **Tuesday, Sept. 27th, 2016 dinner to Sunday, Oct. 2nd, 2016 including breakfast.**

Team Leaders, Coaches, Team Officials, Chaperons have to pay for their accommodation to "OC office" at the Tallink City Hotel.
Credit cards except American Express are accepted.
All phone bills; room services and other possible extra costs are borne by the respective guest/team and must be paid before checkout to the hotel.

The Team Leaders are responsible for the unpaid bills of their team.

MEALS

The official meal vouchers (lunch and dinner), will be added to Event Officials, Judges and Competitors.

Meal Vouchers (lunch and dinner) are valid only in the official Restaurant.

The meal vouchers are not transferable. Bar Code system is in use.

Additional meal vouchers for those holding an ID card (Coaches, Team Leaders, Medical Staff, Officials and Chaperons), can be purchased at the OC Office at Tallink City Hotel.

The price per meal ticket is 20€ per meal (lunch or dinner).



TRANSPORTATION DURING THE EVENT

A shuttle-bus service on 30 min. basis connects the Tallink City Hotel with the ice-rink and return. The distance between the hotel and ice-rink is app. 6 km. The bus stop is in front of the hotel and in front of the ice rink.

The Organizing Committee provides a bus shuttle to meet the teams on arrival. The transportation fee per person from airport to hotel and back is 10€.

ACCREDITATION

The accreditation for all persons will be held at Tallink City Hotel. Officially entered chaperons receive a special permit to use shuttle-bus service. **Passports of the skaters have to be presented at the accreditation.**

EXHIBITION

VARIOUS

Medical Service

There is a permanent medical service at the rinks during all practice and competition hours.

Skate Sharpening

A skate sharpening service is provided free of charge at the Ice Rink. Operation hours are announced later.

Information boxes

The information boxes for the Teams are at the Ice Rink. All official information will be placed there.

Skating Lounge

The "Skating Lounge" is located at the Ice Rink. Competitors, Team-Leaders, Judges, Event Officials and Coaches are very much welcome to visit it.

There is also a Café at the ice arena, which is open daily.

Prize Money

Prize money will be awarded to each medal winner for each category according to the announcement. The individual prize money will be transferred to the National Association concerned after the conclusion of the event. The withholding tax in Estonia is 20%. This percentage has to be deducted from the original amount of the prize money.

The prize money certificates will be presented to the Team Leaders together with the original music, and the diploma on Saturday, October 1st, 2016 after Mens event until 21.00 h at "OC office" at Tallink City Hotel.



USEFUL INFORMATION

Currency exchange:

National currency: 1 Euro = 100 cents

Most of the larger hotels, stores and restaurants accept Visa, MasterCard, Eurocard, Diner's Club and American Express.

There are plenty of Banks and they are easy to find in Tallinn. Most are open from 9:00 to 18:00 on weekdays, while some offices are also open on Saturdays. All banks offer currency exchange services. Exchange offices can also be found in larger hotels, the airport, harbour, railroad station and major shopping centres.

Electricity

The electricity is 220 Volt and most over-sea countries will need an adaptor to fit the plugs, which is standardized two-point plug.

Public transportation

Public buses, trolleys, and trams operate regularly from 6 a.m. to 11 p.m. You may purchase tickets ahead of time at newsstands across the city or a Tallinn Card at the Tallinn City Tourist Office (at Niguliste 2/Kullassepa 4) for unlimited transportation, as well as free admission to museums and sightseeing tours.
